Police and Law enforcement agencies represents a significant majority of all file referrals received by the Civil Forfeiture Office (CFO) . The Program Manager must work proactively to ensure there is an efficient process in place to receive, review and refer files in a timely manner. The position ensures that referrals from Police and Law enforcement file investigations for civil forfeiture consideration are in full compliance with Police and Law enforcement agencies policies and procedures and that these referrals meet the criteria expected by the CFO for acceptance. The position works closely with the Law enforcement agencies senior management and police officers in the field to adhere to policy and maintain confidentiality with respect to completed and on-going criminal investigations.

- Extensive law enforcement experience (a minimum of 10 years) working directly within a law enforcement agency in B.C. of which at least 5 of those years involved working within a specialized section or in a leadership role.
